- **Honor Code and Cadet Led Honor Council** - A Cadet does not lie cheat or steal or tolerate anyone who does.
- **Structure and Organization** - Be at the right place at the right time in the right uniform with a positive attitude.
- **Uniform** – demonstration of pride in self and in our Academy. See the Cadet for who he is - his character not what he is wearing.
- **Formations, drill, parades** - teamwork, collaboration, attention to detail, personal and team accountability

Parent/Patron Orientation – Asks

Don't look at Aeries everyday. There is a lag in posting.

Please trust in and commit to our processes.

Disciplinary incidents are fully investigated before action is taken.

Closed weekends are closed - day cadets are expected to participate in daily activities

If we need to keep your cadet over the weekend for academic or disciplinary reasons please honor our request.

If your cadet commits to an athletic team, please ensure he is here for practice and games including the occasional weekend.



Parent/Patron Orientation – Asks

Please participate in our ANA community. ANAPA needs volunteers, if you cannot volunteer please consider a monetary donation to assist them with hiring extra hands as required.

New Parents/Patrons - expect an adjustment period, if your cadet calls with something that seems extreme, please reach out to the appropriate member of his “bench” - if you are not sure who that is, TAC Officers are always a great place to start. ANAPA leadership is also available to answer any “is this normal at ANA” type questions.

For All - if your cadet calls you with something that has you concerned for his safety - call IMMEDIATELY.



Parent/Patron Orientation – Asks

Respect. Our environment is founded upon mutual respect. In our partnership, I expect my staff to treat you with dignity and respect when you communicate an issue or concern, and I ask the same in return.

Commitment As your cadet commits to being just 1% better each day, I ask that you commit to the completion of his journey and support his attendance from now until graduation. This is a transformational process not a quick fix.

Privacy. We respect the privacy of you and your cadet. We will discuss the status of your cadet only with the designated parent/guardian as reflected in Aeries. Please do not inquire about the status of another cadet.
